

Worldwide Communion Sunday-October 6



On October 6, 2013, during our worship service, we will be having Worldwide Communion Sunday, which reminds us of churches around the world. Since we have a church partnership with the United Church of Christ in the Philippines (UCCP), we will be using the order of worship from their church on that Sunday. Here are some quick facts you might want to know about the UCCP:

- It is the largest Protestant Church in the Philippines.
- There are over 2500 congregations.
- On the last Sunday in September women all over the Philippines participate in "The Fellowship of the Least Coin." On this Sunday, women of the church are called to set aside the smallest denomination coin that they have as a symbol of the poor. Offerings are taken to feed the poor.
- The UCCP adopted a church-wide theme for 2010 to 2014—"Discerning and Obeying God's Will in These Critical Times." In practical terms this means supporting hospitals and seminaries, increased evangelism and more support for church workers.

So, when we commune on the First Sunday in October, we are remembering our oneness in Jesus Christ and around the world.
