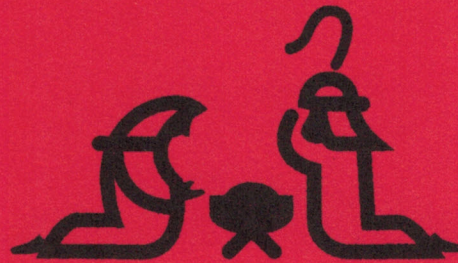

How to prepare for Christmas

I think a lot of us have asked the question "How do I get ready for Christmas?" There are meals to be prepared, decorations to put out, presents to buy, carols to be sung.

But I've never—never in my life, mind you—heard anyone ask "How does Jesus prepare for Christmas?" Think about it for a moment. The Risen Jesus is no longer that baby in the manger. The God/man Jesus Christ makes preparations for Christmas, too, I'm sure. But what are they?

I can't be for sure, none of us can, but based on the Bible, I think I can provide some suggestions of how Jesus might want us to prepare for him.

1. To express, in word and symbol, the hope that Christ brings. In 1 Peter 3:15, the author writes *"Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have."* In other words, why do you have hope in Jesus? What is it about his birth that means something for you? What has Jesus done in your life? Can you put his importance into words? Fortunately, we can also express our joy this Christmastime, not only with words, but with symbols from the Bible as well: angels, stars, a manger and so on.

2. To point, like a laser beam, on places where Jesus is active in the world. For many people the Good News of where Jesus is active is hard to see. The nightly news is all doom and gloom. There doesn't seem to be a person anywhere who cares. Yet, that is exactly where Christ is moving and active in the world. We cannot forget places God was active long ago and continues to be active today:

"How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of the messenger bringing good news, Breaking the news that all's well, proclaiming good times, announcing salvation, telling Zion, "Your God reigns!"—Isaiah 52:7(The Message Bible)

OR

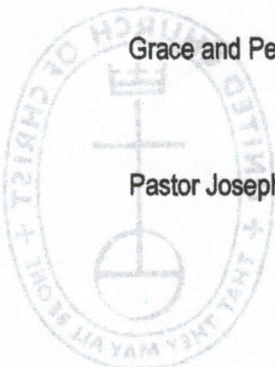
"Comfort, oh comfort my people," says your God. "Speak softly and tenderly to Jerusalem, but also make it very clear that she has served her sentence, that her sin is taken care of—forgiven! She's been punished enough and more than enough, and now it's over and done with."—Isaiah 40:1-2 (The Message).

3.Finally, to get in there and do the work! There are plenty of examples of what Jesus wants us to do and how we are to go about it. From Isaiah's prophecy in Chapter 56 *"This is what the LORD says:"Maintain justice and do what is right, for my salvation is close at hand and my righteousness will soon be revealed."* (New International Version) and from Jesus Himself in Luke 4: *"The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."*

Dear friends, this Christmas I hope you will think on these three examples so that you can provide our Lord and Savior with a great present for Christmas, just as he provides for all our needs. Merry Christmas!

**1/2 BOX CHICKEN BROTH PLUS 2 CHICKEN BOUILLON
CUBES**

1/2 STICK BUTTER

**CHOP CABBAGE AND ONION AND PUT EVERYTHING INTO A

The 1st month of the year is an outstanding one

In the Georgian calendar, the calendar that most of the world uses, January is the very first month of the year. The name January came from a Roman god Janus. According to the Roman legend, in 700 B.C., the ruler Numa Pompilius added January to the end of the 10-month Roman calendar. When it was added, Pompilius gave 30 days to January. However, Romans later made January the first month of the year. Moreover, in 46 B.C. Julius Caesar added a one more day to January and that's why there are 31 in January today. Below are some fun facts about January.

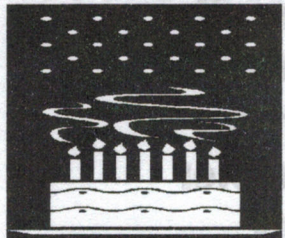
1. The flower symbol of January is snowdrop & carnation.

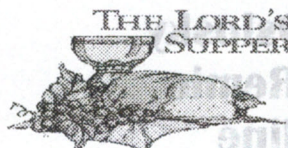
