The Word

I have been very influenced by a new concept lately. In Alan Roxburgh and M. Scott Boren's book Introducing the Missional Church, the author's introduce the distinction between attractional Christianity and missional Christianity.

Attractional Christianity is what most of us are familiar with. It's the faith we grew up with. Churches put out their signs for Vacation Bible School, put an ad in the paper for a youth group event or ham supper. People went to church to get something out of the service or the message.

Missional Christianity, on the other hand, is very different. Just as you cannot hire someone to believe in Jesus for you, you cannot hire someone to do ministry for you. Instead of asking the question, "How do we get people attracted to the church?," the question in a Missional way of thinking is: "What is my mission before God? What am I called to do by God?"

In our 10-10-10 Group this is exactly what we are studying. Research has shown that churches which practice Missional Values explicitly tend to do better in the long run than churches who 'let the chips fall where they may.'

With that in mind, we will be offering new events, new ideas, new programs based on the 10-10-10 Cores below. Watch for specific benefits in your life! Watch for specific ways to see God in the world! And watch God transforming us all.

CHOCOLATE YUMMIES

7 KEEBLER GRAHAMS ORIGINAL

2 1/2 CUPS JET-PUFFED MINIATURE MARSHMALLOWS

1 PACKAGE (12 OZ., 2 CUPS) SEMI-SWEET CHOCOLATE MORSELS

2/3 CUP LIGHT CORN SYRUP

3 TABLESPOONS BUTTER OR MARGARINE

1/2 CUP CRUNCHY PEANUT BUTTER

3 CUPS KELLOGG'S RICE KRISPIES CEREAL

COAT 13X9X2 INCH PAN WITH COOKING SPRAY.

ARRANGE KEEBLER GRAHAMS ORIGINAL CRACKERS IN SINGLE LAYER IN DISH, BREAKING CRACKERS AS NEEDED TO FIT.

SPRINKLE MARSHMALLOWS EVENLY OVER CRACKERS.

BAKE AT 375 F ABOUT 7 MINUTES OR UNTIL MARSHMALLOWS ARE PUFFY. COOL COMPLETELY. IN MEDIUM SAUCEPAN COMBINE CHOCOLATE MORSELS, CORN SYRUP AND BUTTER. APPLE CAKE

- 1 Cup (2 sticks) Butter, softened
- 2 Cups Sugar
- 4 Eggs
- 2 Cups all-purpose Flour
- 2 Teaspoons Baking Powder
- 2 Teaspoons Baking Soda
- 2 Teaspoons Cinnamon
- 6 Cups coarsely chopped, unpeeled Granny Smith apples or any Tart firm Apple such as Fuji or Gala
- 1 Cup Raisins

- 1) Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Butter a Bundt pan.
- 2) Combine butter and sugar in the bowl of an electric mixer. Beat on low Speed until creamy. Add eggs one at a time and continue to blend. Slowly Add flour, baking powder, baking soda and cinnamon; mix well.
- 3) Add apples, raisins and mix with a spoon. Pour into prepared pan.
- 4) Bake about 60 minutes, until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean. Let cool completely before removing from pan. Sprinkle with powdered Sugar, if desired. Serves 16.

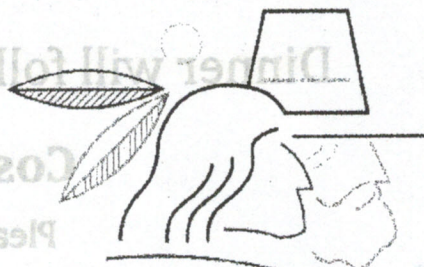
