

THE WORD

¹⁴What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? ¹⁵Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. ¹⁶ If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? ¹⁷ In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.—James 4:14-17

I have been a member of St. Paul's Continuing Care Community's Board in Greenville for a couple of years now (thanks to Ben Walker for getting me involved in this great organization). St. Paul's is located in Greenville, PA and is a retirement home offering various levels of care for senior citizens. It does fantastic work from a Christian perspective, has an engaged, professional staff and dedicated volunteers.

At the last Board Meeting, in mid-April, the staff presented the audit by an outside accounting organization. Everything in the audit came up clean. Board Members received reports upon reports with graphs, charts, figures, and ratios. St. Paul's is a large organization with lots of moving parts; taxes, payroll, insurance, Medicare, liabilities, investments, credits, bond issues, depreciation, and so on.

For a layperson like me, my head was swimming with all these figures and all this paper. Every time I figured something out—one of the accountants would introduce a new technical term and I'd be lost again! It was interesting but I found myself getting a little antsy waiting for the 'real business' of the Board to start.

Midway through the accountants' presentation, though, the above verses from the Book of James came into my head. I saw all the numbers, the facts and figures, the bar graphs and pie charts, as tools for actions or as James says "physical needs." Instead of being bored, I could imagine that this way of running the organization was essential to allow the basic needs of the retired residents to be met. It isn't so much the numbers—it's the meals provided for poor seniors, the prescription medicine provided for the man with Alzheimer's who forgot to take his pills when he lived alone at home. It is the prayer services in the chapel. It is the staff who lovingly provides healing—by changing bandages or monitoring blood pressure.

So, even though sometimes it seems like we're over-involved in what the children in school call 'busywork,' I would encourage you to remember, whatever your setting, that the stories of physical needs being met are powerful examples of the message and work of Jesus. We serve a risen Lord who constantly surprises us by the human stories we hear of transformation and new life!



DUMP CAKE

In a 9X13 baking pan put a can of crushed pineapple and a can of cherry pie filling.

Mix together in pan. Then put yellow cake mix over pineapple-cherry filling.

Spread slowly the yellow cake mix evenly all over the pan to cover everything.

Use spoon to spread out the lumps of the cake mix to make smooth and level.

Dot with a stick of butter sliced thin or a little more to cover pan.

Bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes.

SHIRLEY VEAHMAN

CARROT SOUP SERVES 4
2 TBSP BUTTER
1 SMALL ONION-CHOPPED
1 TBSP. CHOPPED GARLIC
1 APPLE
4 CARROTS-SLICED
1 QT. CHICKEN STOCK
1 CUP OF WATER
1/2 TSP. OF CUMIN
SALT AND PEPPER TO TASTE.

DIRECTIONS: MELT BUTTER -SAUTE ONION, ADD GARLIC
ADD CARROTS AND APPLE-SAUTE FOR 2 MINUTES
ADD CHICKEN STOCK AND CUMIN
BOIL FOR 15-20 MINUTES
PUREE AND ADD SALT AND PEPPER TO TASTE
SINCE I WANTED TO SERVE MORE THAN 4 PEOPLE, I COOKED 8 CARROTS
AND JUST 1/2 OF AN APPLE (THE REVIEWS SAID THAT LESS APPLE WAS BETTER).
I SAUTEED THE ONIONS UNTIL THEY WERE TRANSLUCENT AND THEN ADDED
ABOUT A TEASPOON OF GARLIC POWDER, SINCE I DIDN'T HAVE GARLIC.
I ADDED ABOUT A QUART AND A HALF OF CHICKEN STOCK AND DIDN'T ADD WATER.
ADD SOME IF YOU LIKE THINNER SOUP. SINCE I DIDN'T HAVE CUMIN, I SUBSTITUTED
IT WITH 1/2 TEASPOON OF CHILI POWDER. YOU COULD ADD MORE SPICE IF
YOU LIKE IT SPICIER. AFTER IT WAS COOKED, I TOOK A COUPLE OF CUPS AT A
TIME AND PUT IT IN MY BLENDER TO PUREE. SALT AND PEPPER TO TASTE.
YOU CAN ADD MORE OR LESS OF THE INGREDIENTS TO SUIT YOUR OWN TASTE.
