ice Cream Cake

22 soft ladyfingers
25 Nabisco thin chocolate wafer cookies, finely crushed
(plus more for garnish)
2 Tablespoons unsalted butter, melted
1 pint coffee ice cream
1 pint vanilla ice cream
1 pint java chip ice cram
1 container (8oz.) thawed whipped topping


- 1) Coat a 9 inch springform pan with nonstick cooking spray. Line sides with wax paper.
- 2) Place ladyfingers halves along sides of pan, flat sides facing in. Combine cookie crumbs and butter; press into bottom of pan. Freeze.
- 3) Allow ice cream to stand on counter top until softened. Transfer coffee ice cream to a bowl and stir until good spreading consistency Remove pan from freezer; spread coffee ice cream on bottom. Repeat softening and spreading with vanilla and jave chip ice creams.

Top with thawed whipped topping.

4) Freeze overnight. Remove side of pan and wax paper.

Decorate top of cake with crushed cookies.


