THE WORD

Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead.—John 20:8 & 9.

Dear friends,

First off, happy Easter! I hope that you have had a wonderful experience of the Easter Season and the power of our Risen Lord!

Second, as a preacher, it is difficult for me to get my head around Easter. It's not that I don't believe in the Resurrection of Jesus; I certainly do! But I sympathize with these eyewitnesses to the empty tomb who 'do not understand' the Scripture in John's Gospel.

The reason the resurrection is hard for me to understand is because it is so different from every other experience I've ever seen. Sure, I've heard people say the resurrection is like a caterpillar turning into a butterfly or a seed being buried and bearing fruit (Jesus uses this image himself, John 12:24). Yet, the more I drill down on this idea of a man truly dying and coming back to life, I realize that this event is unique in human history! There is nothing, nothing at all, like resurrection! It is an amazing event that God the Father blessed the creation with. And, for me, no amount of study or thinking about this event makes it any easier for me to understand. The resurrection just is. It exists. The resurrection of Jesus just stands over history, looking out over human events in the same way that the Statue of Liberty looks out over Manhattan.

Maybe in some way, that's what excites me about the resurrection—that I can't get a good handle on it. That means that Jesus and his resurrection is active in the poorest neighborhood and deepest woodland. Jesus' resurrection has an impact at the kitchen table of a couple who fear for their addicted child. Jesus' resurrection hovers over the most cynical stockbroker on Wall Street, who rarely gives a thought to God. His resurrection broods over the Sabbath rest of a mother and her children.

So, my challenge and hope for you this Easter season is that you will look for signs of Jesus and his resurrection in your daily walk and work. Know that the power of resurrection has been loosed in this world and that Christ is alive! We Christians are dealing with unimaginable power and love—which God has gifted us to be witnesses to! That is a great calling and great comfort.





TRESSA'S TOMATO BISQUE

Ingredients

½ cup Butter

3 Tbsp. Basil

1 pint Chicken Broth

29 oz. can Tomato Puree

12 oz. Vegetable juice

1 Cup Heavy Whipping Cream

Directions

Melt the butter in a soup pot. Add the basil to the melted butter to bloom or rehydrate the leaves to release more of the flavor. Next add the tomato puree and blend. Add the vegetable juice and blend. Add the chicken broth and blend. Simmer until comes to a light boil. Next add the whipping cream and blend. Finally serve.

- * Optional you can add freshly chopped basil on top and even croutons.
- * Pairs great with Toasted Cheese, or Crusty Bread slices, or oyster crackers.

TRESSA'S RICOTTA GNOCCHI'S

Ingredients

Serves 4

Gnocchi's Simple Pasta Sauce

10 oz. ricotta cheese 28oz can crushed tomatoes 1 tsp. salt

1 large egg 1 medium onion chopped 1 tsp. pepper

½ cup finely grated Parmesan Cheese 1 clove garlic, crushed 1 tsp. sugar

½ tsp. salt ½ tsp. garlic powder ½ tsp. onion powder

34 to 1 cup flour 1 bay leaf (remove from sauce once done cooking)

1 Tbsp. Olive oil 1 Tbsp. Basil

Directions

Gnocchi's

Set a strainer lined with 3 coffee filters in the sink. Add the ricotta cheese and let drain for about an hour.

In a large bowl mix the strained ricotta, egg, cheese, salt, and $\frac{3}{4}$ cup flour until well blended. Cover and refrigerate for 15 min.

Check the dough by rolling a bit in your hand, it should be a little tacky. If its more like chewing gum add more flour 1 Tbsp. at a time until it's tacky. Refrigerate for another 15 min.

While your waiting place a large pot of water on the stove to bring to a boil. Sprinkle a baking sheet with flour and set close to your work area.

Now remove the dough from the refrigerator. Sprinkle your work area and your hands with flour. Break off a tennis ball sized piece and roll into a log about ¾ inch thick. Using a sharp knife cut into ¾ inch pieces. You can either leave them as little pillow shapes or roll with your thumb and the back of a fork to get the traditional gnocchi look.

Transfer the batch to the floured baking sheet and toss with the flour to prevent sticking. Repeat the rolling and cutting process with the remaining dough.

Add an additional ½ tsp of salt to the boiling water. Then add half of the gnocchi batch. Gently stir to make sure they don't stick. Once they come to the surface, let them cook 2 more minutes. Remove with a slotted spoon to the colander to finish draining.

Repeat with the second half of the batch.

Toss with sauce and serve immediately.

Sauce

In a deep pot, sauté your chopped onions in olive oil, once soft add in your crushed garlic and continue to sauté. Mix all of your ingredients together, heat to a boil and then reduce to a simmer. Cover and simmer 30 minutes, occasionally stirring to prevent burning. Remove the bay leaf.






